

Creating Quizzes in Moodle

- 1) Use the steps in "[Write Questions in the Aiken Format](https://www.umass.edu/it/support/moodle/import-quiz-questions-moodle-using-aiken-format)" to format your MC and T/F questions for importing. Stop at the Import Questions section (we will return to it later)

After looking over this information – follow the instructions in Step 1 and go to the “Use the Moodle Questions Bank” link on the page or below and follow those steps to create a category for your quiz/exam questions.

- 3) Setting up a category in the question database

You may want to make a separate category for each questions type you will have in your exam. If you want to add x# of random questions separate categories for each type of questions will make it easier.
