- □ Acceptance letters and selection
- Housing assignments
- Orientation programs
- □ I'm in college now... and I love it!

Tip #1: Changing Roles

- Discussing expectations with your child
 - How often will we talk on the phone? Text? Email?
 - Conduct and behavior
 - Interaction during breaks
- Problem Solving
 - Point to resources
- □ Enjoy the excitement (and nerves!)



Culture Shock

- □ Reality sets in
- □ Living on campus
- College classroom / expectations
- □ Independence vs. clinging to familiar for support

Tip #2: Academic Adjustment

- □ Ask about classes & grades
 - What did you go over in your Intellectual Journey class?
 - When are you starting to study for your math exam?
- □ Make suggestions
 - It sounds like you should sign up for a tutor
 - Go to class!
- Wait until Family Weekend to Visit



Initial Adjustment

- Initial successes
- Developing a routine
- Dissipation of homesickness
- □ Increased confidence
- □ Sense of wellbeing

Tip #3: Celebrate Success

Encourage reflection

- Hear how they were successful (so you can reinforce that process when they have challenges later)
- Return to goals & expectations
 Capitalize on initial high-point to reinforce standards
 Congratulate and recognize what has gone well



Mental Isolation

- \square 2nd culture shock
- Caught between two worlds
- Heightened homesickness
 - Home isn't the same anymore
- Doubt increases about choices in:
 - College
 - Major
 - Career

Tip #4: Social Adjustment

- Assume your son/daughter is attending certain events... and ask about them!
 - What clubs did you see at the Organization Fair?
 - What intramural team did you join?
 - What has your Peer Coach / RA said about that?
- □ Take panic with a grain of salt
 - Have you talked to your adviser? The CPRC?
 - Reach out to FYE Office for suggestions & resources
- □ Do not ask if they are homesick!
